


# Budget Bulletin





The 2023-2024 Annual Budget is the third consecutive year of a three-year plan with set objectives, which aims to achieve a number of outcomes, including a targeted reduction in operating deficit, removing any reliance upon previous year's surplus funds for the following year's service operations, while achieving improved Financial Health Indicator.

Within the budget, all revenues and expenditures - including capital works, external grants, debt funding, loan receipts/payments and the application of reserves - will result in a balanced budget forecast of \$0 for the 2023-2024 financial year.

Looking to this year's budget, we are pleased to announce the Shire has allocated \$1.6 million for the Nullagine Aquatic Centre and \$1.26 million for the Nullagine Multipurpose Sports Facility, in addition to 2022-2023 funds set aside.

Once completed, these facilities will bring more vibrancy, activity and entertainment for the people in and around Nullagine.

Customer service will also be better supported this year, and moving forward, as we are investing in better software for community-facing, customer service interactions.

We are pleased to announced that after a three-year journey, we have almost completed the Marble Bar Airport, which will enable 100+ seater aircrafts to land there.

We are waiting on Civil Aviation Safety Authority approval, which should come through soon.

The venture was first announced as part of the 2019/2020 Annual Budget, as part of the COVID-19 response, and then grew into a joint venture with Atlas Iron and Calidus Resources to provide an outcome that will benefit the Marble Bar region for years to come.

#### **COMMUNITY AMENITIES** \$7,835,991

Plus \$630,000 for Newman Landfill heavy equipment.



#### RECREATION AND **CULTURE \$15,996,005**

Plus \$300.000 for a **new Wilara Park Newman Ablution Facility.** 

Plus Newman Aquatic and netball Courts lighting upgrades of \$460,000.

Plus \$2.86M for a Nullagine Aquatic and Multipurpose Sports facilities.



#### LAW, ORDER AND PUBLIC **SAFETY \$1,543,091**

**Including CCTV operations** throughout Newman, Nullagine and Marble Bar townsites.



#### **HEALTH \$827,904**

The promotion and implementation of the Mosquito Management Plan covers the prevention, monitoring

and treatment of potential mosquito breeding.



#### **TRANSPORT \$28,853,507**

Which includes a 50% road grading increase (+\$750,000), a 210% increase in drainage (+\$340,000) and a floodways upgrade (+\$200,000).



#### **EDUCATION AND** WELFARE \$3,175,049

Including a year-round events program throughout the Shire, across all three townsite.

Running youth programs, including school holiday activities.

## HOW OTHER CHARGES AFFECT RATES

Services that the Shire pays for, such as street lighting, are often subject to price increases beyond the Shire's control. These costs are passed onto the Shire, which increases budget requirements, which in turn increases rates.

## HOW COMMUNITY FACILITIES AFFECT RATES

The local community, through the Strategic Community Plan, determines priorities for services and facilities, which impact upon Council budget decisions, which in turn, drives the amount of rates funding required towards Shire service delivery and infrastructure improvements.
