REPORT PURPOSE

For Council to endorse the Implementation Plan for the Shire of East Pilbara Strategic Recreation Master Plan.

BACKGROUND

The Strategic Recreation Master Plan final draft was completed in November 2021 and endorsed by council at the 19 November 2021 Ordinary Council Meeting, with the following recommendations:

That Council:

- 1. endorses the Shire of East Pilbara Strategic Recreation Master Plan as the basis for the consideration of future recreation priorities for the District;
- 2. directs the Chief Executive Officer to develop an implementation plan to be brought back to Council for consideration with a financial planning process included; and
- 3. notes that all projects outlined within an Implementation Plan will still be subject to Council's annual budget deliberation process including ongoing operating costs for the relevant facility.

COMMENTS/OPTIONS/DISCUSSIONS

Following the endorsement of the Strategic Recreation Master Plan, officers prepared a detailed Implementation Plan attached as **Appendix 1** that outlines the projects listed for Newman, Nullagine and Marble Bar and the proposed timeline for these projects to be undertaken.

On Thursday 24 February 2022, Elected Members participated in a workshop where the implementation plan was reviewed and the proposed projects, timelines and funding options were detailed. From this workshop, the final Implementation plan has been prepared.

Since the master plan's endorsement, the Shire has been able to secure funding to enable several projects identified in the Strategic Recreation Master Plan to commence as well as funding for additional recreation infrastructure projects to commence in 2022/23.

These projects include:

Newman Netball Courts

Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program – Phase 2 \$800,000

Replacing Toilet Block at Netball Precinct

- Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 3 \$140,000
- Subject to Council approval for project to commence in 2022/23

Emu Oval Sports Lighting

- Funding confirmed from DLGSC \$113,500 and Cricket Australia \$30,000
- SOEP funds \$226,500 to be allocated in 2022/23 Budget

Nullagine Swimming Pool

- Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 3 \$750,000
- \$30k for Feasibility study to be completed 2021/22

Marble Bar Swimming Pool

Dept. Education contribution of \$25,000 for business case development.

Newman Aquatic Centre

- Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program Phase 3 \$1.2 million
- Upgrade of plant and aquatic infrastructure to include resurfacing the pool, shade structures and heating to provide 52 week access.

The Implementation Plan for the Shire of East Pilbara Strategic Recreation Master Plan will guide Council in the delivery of essential recreation infrastructure over the next ten to fifteen years.

In addition it is recommended that Council formally authorise the inclusion of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program funding of \$1.2 million in the 2021/22 budget and its allocation to the Newman Aquatic Centre project, to facilitate the processing of the Shire's application and payment of the funds under the Program from the Federal Government.

Other than current secured Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program funding for existing projects, there are no current resources allocated which will need to be considered as part of future budgetary processes. It is recommended that Council considers the projects included as part of 10-year Long Term Financial Planning process, (incorporating asset management planning), and investigating all opportunities for external funding to complement municipal fund contributions. It is also recommended that an adjustment to the budget be approved to commence works on the Newman Aquatic Centre, as follows:
